

■ Project Profile: Flat Conversions High Street, Worcester

- The conversion of the top two storeys of a prominent city centre building for Housing Association flats. The ground and first floors became a branch of the Alliance and Leicester Bank and the second floor was converted for office use. The conversion earned the practice a City of Worcester Award for the contribution the refurbishment made to the quality of the city.



The work on the turn of the century building involved restoring the impressive copper cupola with its' gilded spire and the creation of five new rented flats in the previously vacant top floors. The work was carried out for Harden Housing Association. The flats are "quirky and really quite spacious, with the corner turret providing delightful rooms complete with a view of the Malverns". The flat conversions took a little over 9 months to complete, including a complete renewal of the roof covering.
