

■ Project Profile: Residential Alterations and Extensions Worcestershire



Architects

- This country house east of Worcester which dated back to the C16, has a new garden 'front'. A generous kitchen with hand painted units and an Aga is the heart of the house. A new, airy breakfast area was added to take advantage of the morning sun and views of the rear garden within which it's soaring Victorian style timbered roof added drama to the interior whilst generous glazing maximised its key position.



The project included a complete refurbishment of the interiors and the replacement of 1950's and 70's unsympathetic windows to achieve a degree of harmony throughout. The 1960's flat roof infill to the garden elevation gained a pitched roof, twinning the original gable.



Problems with the front wall to the cellar were remedied cost effectively by constructing simple buttresses internally with linking arches, which also formed an excellent wine storage facility.
